

# Taekwondo Chungdokwan GB

## PRIVACY NOTICE FOR OUR MEMBERS

We are committed to respecting your privacy. This notice is to explain how we may use personal information we collect before, during and after your affiliation with us. This notice applies to you if you have registered to become or are affiliated to our association. This notice explains how we comply with the law on data protection, what your rights are and for the purposes of data protection we will be the controller of any of your personal information.

References to **we**, **our** or **us** in this privacy notice are to Taekwondo Chungdokwan GB (TCGB).

We have not appointed a Data Protection Officer to oversee our compliance with data protection laws as we are not required to do so, but the TCGB President will act as Data Protection Compliance Manager and has overall responsibility for data protection compliance in our organisation. Contact details are set out in the "Contacting us" section at the end of this privacy notice.

### 1. PERSONAL INFORMATION WE MAY COLLECT FROM YOU

- 1.1 Clubs are affiliated to TCGB. Individuals do not hold membership with TCGB. This membership is held with clubs and British Taekwondo. However, we may hold information on individual members as a result of, for example, their participation in events and competitions.
- 1.2 In respect of clubs you may provide us with or we may obtain personal information about you such as;
  - personal contact details that allows us to contact you directly such as name, title, email addresses and telephone numbers;
  - membership start and end date;
  - records of your interactions with us such as telephone conversations, emails and other correspondence and your instructions to us;
  - any disciplinary and grievance information.
- 1.3 In respect of individuals you may provide us with or we may obtain personal information about you, through your club, for purposes such as Dan gradings, Kukkiwon certification, bursary applications. This personal information may include;
  - Personal contact details that allows is to contact you directly such as name, titles, email addressed and telephone numbers;
  - Date of birth;
  - Gender;
  - British Taekwondo membership number and expiry date;
  - Your TCGB affiliation club
  - Details of next of kin, coaches and emergency contacts
  - Records of your attendance at events or competitions hosted by us;

### 2. SPECIAL CATEGORIES OF PERSONAL INFORMATION

We may also collect, store and use the following "**special categories**" of more sensitive personal information regarding you:

- 2.1 information about your race or ethnicity;
- 2.2 information about your health, including any medical condition, health and sickness records, medical records and health professional information.

We may not collect all the above types of special category personal information about you. In relation to the special category personal data that we do process we do so on the basis that
- 2.3 the processing is necessary for reasons of substantial public interest, on a lawful basis;
- 2.4 it is necessary for the establishment, exercise or defence of legal claims;
- 2.5 it is necessary for the purposes of carrying out the obligations and exercising our or your rights in the field of employment and social security and social protection law; or

2.6 based on your explicit consent.

In the table below we refer to these as the “special category reasons for processing of your personal data”.

### 3. WHERE WE COLLECT YOUR INFORMATION

We typically collect personal information about our clubs when you apply to become an affiliate of TCGB, when you purchase any services or products we offer, when you make a query and/or complaint or when you correspond with us by phone, e-mail or in some other way; or you make an application for bursary funding or for a Dan Grade Test.

We also may collect personal information about you from any third party references you provide as part of the application process for membership.

If you are providing us with next of kin, beneficiaries, family members and emergency contacts they have a right to know and to be aware of how what personal information we hold about them, how we collect it and how we use and may share that information. Please share this privacy notice with those of them whom you feel are sufficiently mature to understand it. They also have the same rights as set out in the “**Your rights in relation to personal information**” section below.

### 4. USES MADE OF THE INFORMATION

The table below describes the main purposes for which we process your personal information, the categories of your information involved and our lawful basis for being able to do this.

<b>To send you other marketing information we think you might find useful or which you have requested from us, including our newsletters, information about events and products.</b>	Contact details and marketing preferences.	Where you have given us your explicit consent to do so.
<b>To answer your queries or complaints.</b>	Contact details and records of your interactions with us	We have a legitimate interest to provide complaint handling services to you in case there are any issues with your or your clubs interaction with TCGB.
<b>Retention of records.</b>	All the personal information we collect.	We have a legitimate interest in retaining records whilst they may be required in relation

We need to retain records to properly administer and manage your and your club's relationship with TCGB and run our association and in some cases, we may have legal or regulatory obligations to retain records.</p> <p>We process special category personal data on the basis of the "special category reasons for processing of your personal data" referred to in section 2 above.</p>
<b>To administer your attendance at any courses or programmes you sign up to.</b>	All contact and membership details, transaction and payment data.	This is necessary to enable us to register you on to and properly manage and administer your attendance on the course and/or programme.
<b>To use information about your physical or mental health (including any injuries) or disability status, to ensure your health and safety and to assess your fitness to participate in any events or activities we host and to provide appropriate adjustments to our sports facilities.</b>	Health and medical information	We process special category personal data on the basis of the "special category reasons for processing of your personal data" referred to in section 2 above.
<b>To gather evidence for possible grievance or disciplinary hearings.</b>	All the personal information we collect	<p>We have a legitimate interest in doing so to provide a safe and fair environment for all affiliates, and to ensure the effective management of any disciplinary hearings, appeals and adjudications.</p> <p>We process special category personal data on the basis of the "special category reasons for processing of your personal data" referred to in section 2 above.</p> <p>For criminal records history we process it on the basis of legal obligations or based on your explicit consent.</p>
<b>For the purposes of equal opportunities monitoring.</b>	Name, title, date of birth gender, information about your race or ethnicity and health and medical information	<p>We have a legitimate interest to promote a sports environment that is inclusive, fair and accessible.</p> <p>We process special category personal data on the basis of the "special category reasons for processing of your personal data" referred to in section 2 above.</p>

Where you have given us your consent to use your personal information in a manner, you have the right to withdraw this consent at any time, which you may do by contacting us as described in the "Contacting us" section below.

Please note however that the withdrawal of your consent will not affect any use of the data made before you withdrew your consent and we may still be entitled to hold and process the relevant personal information to

the extent that we are entitled to do so on bases other than your consent. Withdrawing consent may also have the same effects as not providing the information in the first place, for example we may no longer be able to provide certain or all member benefits to you.

## 5. DIRECT MARKETING

**Email, post and SMS marketing:** from time to time, we may contact affiliated clubs by email, post or SMS with information about products and services we believe you may be interested in.

You can also unsubscribe from our marketing by clicking on the unsubscribe link in the marketing messages we send to you.

## 6. DISCLOSURE OF YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION

We share personal information with the following parties:

6.1 **Any party approved by you.**

6.2 **To any governing bodies or regional bodies for the sports covered by our club:** to allow them to properly administer the sports on a local, regional and national or international level.

6.3 **The Government or our regulators:** where we are required to do so by law or to assist with their investigations or initiatives.

6.4 **Police, law enforcement and security services:** to assist with the investigation and prevention of crime and the protection of national security.

## 7. TRANSFERRING YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION INTERNATIONALLY

The personal information we collect is not transferred to or stored in countries outside of the UK and the European Union.

## 8. HOW LONG DO WE KEEP PERSONAL INFORMATION FOR?

The duration for which we retain your personal information will differ depending on the type of information and the reason why we collected it from you. However, in some cases personal information may be retained on a long-term basis: for example, personal information that we need to retain for legal purposes will normally be retained in accordance with usual commercial practice and regulatory requirements. Generally, where there is no legal requirement we retain all physical and electronic records for a period of 7 years after your last contact with us or the end of your membership. Exceptions to this rule are:

8.1 Details regarding unsuccessful membership applicants where we hold records for a period of not more than 12 months;

8.2 Information that may be relevant to personal injury or discrimination claims may be retained until the limitation period for those types of claims has expired. For personal injury or discrimination claims this can be an extended period as the limitation period might not start to run until a long time after the event.

It is important to ensure that the personal information we hold about you is accurate and up-to-date, and you should let us know if anything changes, for example if you change your phone number or email address. To update the personal information we hold about you, you can contact us by using the details set out in the "**Contacting us**" section below.

## 9. YOUR RIGHTS IN RELATION TO PERSONAL INFORMATION

You have the following rights in relation to your personal information:

- the right to be informed about how your personal information is being used;
- the right to access the personal information we hold about you;
- the right to request the correction of inaccurate personal information we hold about you;
- the right to request the erasure of your personal information in certain limited circumstances;
- the right to restrict processing of your personal information where certain requirements are met;
- the right to object to the processing of your personal information;
- the right to request that we transfer elements of your data either to you or another service provider; and

- the right to object to certain automated decision-making processes using your personal information.

You should note that some of these rights, for example the right to require us to transfer your data to another service provider or the right to object to automated decision making, may not apply as they have specific requirements and exemptions which apply to them and they may not apply to personal information recorded and stored by us. However, some have no conditions attached, so your right to withdraw consent or object to processing for direct marketing are absolute rights.

Whilst this privacy notice sets out a general summary of your legal rights in respect of personal information, this is a very complex area of law. More information about your legal rights can be found on the Information Commissioner's website at <https://ico.org.uk/for-the-public/>.

If you are unhappy with the way we are using your personal information you can also complain to the UK Information Commissioner's Office or your local data protection regulator. We are here to help and encourage you to contact us to resolve your complaint first.

## **10. CHANGES TO THIS NOTICE**

We may update this privacy notice from time to time. When we change this notice in a material way, we will update the version date at the bottom of this page. For significant changes to this notice we will try to give you reasonable notice unless we are prevented from doing so. Where required by law we will seek your consent to changes in the way we use your personal information.
